PAST ACTIVITIES

Setting up a pilot project in Assam and supporting NGOs (Tata Trusts)
Support to NERLP in community development planing and capacity building
Capacity building of NGOs in Central and Eastern India
Setting up of NGO forum in Assam and work on MGNREGS
Training of frontline officers in Jharkhand on INRM for MGNREGSS

PILOT PROJECT ON IRRIGATED AGRICULTURE IN ASSAM

The project created irrigation facilities for the cultivation of vegetables and plantation crops in the homesteads of about 400 farmers mainly in Kamrup Rural district.

Micro pump-sets (kerosene, electric and solar) were used in large scale for the first time in the area

INITIATING NGO FORUM IN ASSAM AND WORK ON MGNREGS

Trainings were conducted for all junior engineers and assistant engineers from all blocks of 6 districts (Kamrup Rural, Goalpara, Bongaigaon, Nalbari, Barpeta, and Kokrajhar)

NGOs facilitated development of plans for individual livelihood asset creation in 30 villages under 10 development blocks of 7 districts

Out of 610 schemes submitted, for the FY2017-18, 346 NRM related schemes received technical sanction

SIGNIFICANCE OF UDALGURI PROJECT

First of its kind collaboration between a state rural livelihood mission, a private donor and an NGO

Entrepreneurship of the local youth as pivot. Creation of an eco-system of entrepreneurship for rapid economic growth

Project area has gone through decades of isolation and strife. Success will set an example

Only place in Assam for MGNREGS to be used extensively for individual livelihood asset creation. Direct transition from wage to self employment

New technology and methods being introduced extensively

Rapid advances in reaching households.

Excellent working relationship with SRLM, government and local government institutions



6,000 households
122 villages

THREE BROAD STREAMS OF ACTIVITIES (Integrated at village level)

MGNREGS has been accessed to create individual livelihood assets - farm ponds, pigsties etc.

Improved inputs, new techniques and approaches have been introduced for improved cultivation and better return from agriculture

Small pig farms provide breeding services and supply healthy piglets of Hampshire breeds

Regular vaccination, de-worming of animals and poultry

New entrepreneurs – both women and men from local area – have been instrumental in adopting and spreading these inputs, technologies, methods and tools.

10 tons of commercial paddy seeds produced by entrepreneurs for sale among local farmers in the current Kharif season



Udalguri Project

Rain shelters ensure year-round vegetable cultivation in heavy rainfall areas like Udalguri. A unit of this size can ensure Rs 25,000 net return in a year



Udalguri Project

Commercial crops like watermelons can generate quick returns when the land is fallow otherwise



Udalguri Project

Net houses like this are used by entrepreneurs to raise improved plant materials for sale (black pepper, lemon, vegetable seedlings and so on). All 13 agricultural entrepreneurs own a shed each.

New breed (Hampshire) being introduced through the entrepreneurs. 1,095 households started rearing following improved methods.

A low cost pigsty like this can radically improve pig rearing. 2,000 families have come forward to build such pigsties

Ms Ringkhang Daimari, one of the new entrepreneurs, has earned a net income of Rs. 52,408 in 9 months. There are 17 such entrepreneurs and more to be inducted soon

LIVELIHOOD SCOPING STUDY FOR FOREST DWELLERS

Commissioned by OXFAM India, KABIL studied the possibility of various livelihood options for families who have accessed land under Forest Rights Act

The study was undertaken the selected villages across Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha

HUMAN RESOURCES

14 Full time functionaries + 4 part time staff and retainer consultants

Six out of the 14 full-time functionaries have been women

Out of the 18 functionaries, 10 are in the experience level between 0 and 6 years, 4 have between 10 and 20 years and the rest 4 have experience of three decades or more

STAFF CAPACITY BUILDING

Newly recruited young staff went through two phase

“process awareness and sensitivity” training

All the functionaries have also undergone

“entrepreneurial motivation training”

The annual retreat had participation from all full and part time functionaries
